NORDIC TEXTILE ART - ADVANCED DIALOGUE - What happens when the habit is broken and the obvious is erased? When we challenge our relationship to the material and place it in new contexts? The aim of the project is to deepen contacts and collaboration between artists and organizations for textile arts in each Nordic country and to create a mobility with new forums for textile art where the Baltic countries are included in our textile network

Textile art in the Nordic countries - the conversation continues.

Long-term network support (2015 - 2018) gave us the opportunity to strengthen the Nordic collaboration that we have been striving for from the start in our association and our network. To meet over the web and in social media is evolving and enriching, but the most important experience is to really meet face to face. Over time, being able to create lasting relationships, to get together in our profession where the personal meeting also gets room, creates a basis for continued collaboration and development. During the pandemic, we have even more realized the importance of meeting in real life.

The purpose of the network collaboration was both development of competencies and development of the textile art field. The goal was to create a Nordic platform where new interpretation, innovation and renewal of the textile art is given room.

Forssa Textile Week. Nordic Textile Art were invited to be a collaboration partner and to be a speaker in a panel discussion. The theme country for the year 2024 event was Sweden. Forssa and the Finnish printed textile heritage share a common story with Swedish neighbours. Josabet Werkmäster was given the task of suggesting designers regarding an exhibition or pop-up shop. The four-day event contains talks, exhibitions and pop-up sales. The idea is to provide the audience with a possibility to learn about sustainable textile design and to buy high-quality products. Collaboration partners were also TEXO, Aalto University, The Swedish Museum in Textile and Pattern from Agency.

Networking meeting and closing the project. Reflection, evaluation, summary. The project team leaders Josabet Werkmäster, Maria Johansson and Elisabeth Brenner Remberg meet in Malmö, happy about the experiences and the strong and important network that has been built.

More about the workshops and how activities contributed to innovation within network's area of activities.

The location for the workshop 2022 was Målargården in Rättvik, a family house with large areas., and cultural values from both the present and the past. Organizers for the days: Josabet Werkmäster, Elisabeth Brenner Remberg and Maria Johansson.

"What happens when you bring your conversation piece to Rättvik" We all had a short presentation during the stay as a part of talk textile/textile talk theme. We did the cooking and cleaning together and the dinner days shared by Sweden, Denmark, Finland and Iceland.

On the program: -Textile tour to give input of the local and Swedish craft signature hot spots: Jobs handtryck and Insjöns Väveri. -Workshop Textile talk/talk textile. Gathering thoughts, ideas, and expectations. - A guided tour at the folk museum "Gammelgården" to give us the historical references of our theme and the guide Raine Mickels gave us the perspectives.

In 2023, the trip went to Estonia with stops in Tallinn Viljandi, Heimtali, Põltsamaa, Äksi, Tartu and Esna. We lived together in the countryside in Männiku Metsatalu. Organizers for the days: Kadi Pajupuu and Aet Ollisaar.

On the program: -Tours to the modern textile factory Paragon Sleep and to Äksi historical wool mill. At Heimtali Museum we met the legendary textile artist Anu Raud.

-Visits to studios and exhibitions of local artists. -Every participant had a short presentation of 3 textiles from 3 different decades that are significant for the speaker or to the textile culture of her country. -Kadi Pajupuu introduced MultiWeave technique in a workshop. -Textile excursion at Estonian National Museum. Exhibition of handprinted souvenir-scarves from 70-s to 80-s.

In August 2024, it was time for part 3. Sharing time, culture, thoughts and impressions together was rich and meaningful. Important to create network for peace in times of fear and a war so close. Organizers for the days: Monika Žaltauskaitė Grašienė and Jolanta Smitiene.

More on the program: Exhibition at Gallery Balta - Visiting Lithuanian artist association gallery in Kaunas. - Textile tour to Rumšiškės, visiting Ethnography Museum of Lithuania, tour to the countryside, Makniūnai village, Alytus district. Also, to Marcinkonys visit the artist run "Verpėjos". - Workshop "Talk with Textile -Talk with Nature" with Greta Kardi. Find a relationship with nature, talk to nature through textiles and talk to nature through textiles.

Textile networking - innovation and development for the textile arts.

Part one Sweden,

Målargården in Rättvik. A family house with large areas, artist studio, inspiring environment, and cultural values from both the present and the past. Ceramic, original sketches of art assignments and cultural values surround the visitor or guest. A unique venue that inspired our wide spread of age group, young master students to senior textile artists, and countries, to be comfortable. Womanhood synergy became clear when the workshop of group dynamic and meet and greet evolved to singing together, country specific lyrics. Målargården have a unique collection of folk costumes from the 17th century, and they were also demonstrated and worn during the introduction of this network workshop.

Later when visiting Estonia, the Swedish impressions were that national historical traditional textile slöjd and textile craft are highly valued aesthetics in both Estonia and Lithuania, connected to identity and value for a country that had been war-torn and occupied. When visiting both Anu

Rauds House (artist home and gallery) and Estonian National Gallery where scarves from the Sing and Dance festival were declared as symbols of secret national colours and messages.

During a difficult time with undertones of war and ongoing uncertainties, establishing network mobility around the Baltic Sea, is a force in itself. The goal was to stimulate the textile art network, create textile talks, contributing to lasting connections between the Baltic Sea countries.

Looking back, networking around textiles strengthens the female quality and empowerment, respect, safety, and shared humanity. This collaboration partner contributed to a result in reassuring group synergy and advanced textile dialogue that were identified in collaborative spirits of the network intentions. It strengthened the relations through textile culture as activator, and peaceful bonds were created, when equality and humanitarian values were addressed.

Part two Estonia, Timelapse tour. Eesti Tekstiilikunstnike liit, was the organiser of the workshop and the tour in Estonia.

We traveled through; Tallinn-Viljandi-Heimtali-Põltsamaa-Äksi-Tartu-Esna. It gave a geographic view of the textile culture of this Baltic country.

The collaboration between the Estonian textile organisation and Nordic Textile Art led to an online publication. It came clear during this tour that books and artbook printing possibilities are strongly encouraged and book printing possibilities are strong in Estonia and Lithuania. The written has a history of being erased by war power. Cultural heritage of now-like our-*Textile talk art book*, therefore have a possibility to be created and exist.

Part three Kaunas, Lithuania Gallery Balta- In Kaunas the participants of the textile talk-advanced dialogue performed an exhibition and reached out to the community of Kaunas and Lithuanian TV was also present, interviewing Josabet Werkmäster and Elisabeth Brenner Remberg. The exhibition is themed around sharing tender memories that evoke the deepest emotions.

Gallery Balta founded by Jolanta Šmitienė gave us a unique opportunity to showcase our work in such a setting that felt both humbling and empowering. The feedback was especially inspiring, as it reminded us of the universal language of art that transcends borders.

This platform of Gallery Balta both stimulated heartfelt impressions through the story of Jolanta Šmitienė, her mother was imprisoned and her cross of belief embroidered with her hair in the prison cell during World War two.

Maria Johansson NTA Sweden, exhibited textile weave sculptures of weave techniques learnt through this expanded network collaboration. One weave of a multi weave, on a loom crafted by herself. Maria Johansson learnt the technique through macrame rope in a workshop with Kadi Pajupuu of the Estonian partner. Kadi is the inventor of this technique of weaving and has crafted the original loom. This aesthetic of exhibiting Maria has extended through an exhibition in Stockholm during Stockholm Craft week autumn 2024 at Konsthantverkscentrum.

A lookbook about Textile Talk/Talk Textile in Lithuania was produced with help of Kadi Pajupuu.







Textile Talk/ Talk Textile generates and creates new dialogues and spreads knowledge.

Network and development work with an artistic workshop is a good and rewarding form. Conversations arise and new contacts are made, which in turn give rise to meeting in new contexts. Interest in what is happening within textile art in the Nordic and Baltic countries has grown. Thanks to our activities, the contacts have spread both locally, nationally and internationally. Several participants in the project also teach in the textile field, passing on their knowledge to their students. New collaboration partners and new exhibitions have also emerged. The participants have spread information in their organizations about various artist residency and other opportunities that are available within the network's area.

New contacts, new collaborations.

The project's networking activities have branched out into a number of new collaborations and new contacts. Above all, this has resulted in the creation of new platforms for knowledge exchange and international collaborations on a professional level.

Textile art in the Nordic and Baltic countries - the conversation continues.

Through long-term network funding we have been given the opportunity to strengthen the Nordic and Baltic collaboration that we have striven in our association and our network. We feel confirmed that the work we are doing is right.

To be able to create lasting relationships over time, to meet in our profession where personal contact is also given space, creates a basis for continued cooperation and development. An important experience is that things take time and that the effect of a project can show results in future unforeseen events. Our international network has grown and continues spread. One experience is that just as we in the Nordic and Baltic countries are interested in what is happening in other countries, there is also a great interest from many parts of the world in what is happening with us and to be part of our network.

We feel that we now have a strong network, a network to build on.



Voices from participants in the project.

- It is so important to have these meetings and get a compact view of other artists' work and to the way of thinking. When you have intensive time together, the time is spent in the best possible way.
- The impressions gave me a great creative power and meeting with colleagues gave energy for a long time. Just talking to like-minded colleagues is very inspiring. It was very interesting to see the working process even though I have seen it before. I have worked in printing many years ago.
- For me as an artist the network is important because I can get to know artists from different countries and see how they work and think. It is important to meet people with a similar mindset and the same affection- love for textiles. For my organization it is important that the cooperation is across borders. The network gives an opportunity to intreduce artworks and to see the works of artists from different countries. Direct contact gives an opportunity to understand and see.
- I am a Professional textile designer; nowadays I work as a one person team, making textile art. To be able to spend days in a inspiringly environment together with like-minded people gives us all a lot, to spend days together with professional textile artists from other countries, with such different experiences is like ring on the water. It makes you look upon your own work in in new directions, and it enlarges your network in a very positive way. Gives you possibilities to travel and study and make plans for future exhibitions in foreign countries.
- The experience has reinforced our desire to continue exploring the relationship between tradition and modernity in our work. We are eager to incorporate new textures, colors, and techniques inspired by what we saw in Lithuania. The time we spent with the local artists and the unique cultural atmosphere of the places we visited have undoubtedly shaped our thinking and will influence our future projects.
- Nordic textile art is not significantly different from Estonian textile art. Every artist is special, and that's why it's important to establish contacts across national borders.
- In Nordic countries we have so many similarities and it is difficult to recognize them. We have many funding possibilities and textiles are getting closer to the visual art scene, borders between art forms are getting blurrier, as they should be.



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
